We would love to hear from you if there is a streetlight not working in your area. We report all faulty streetlights to our contractor daily who will add them to the work schedule to be fixed.

We are in the process of producing stickers for all our columns to help make it easier for our residents to identify when a streetlight is faulty. This will include our telephone no if you wish to call us; a unique reference no. (URN) AND a QR code which you can scan using a smart phone. This will automatically generate an

email...so no need to to call us!
