

### Thorpe St Andrew gets **THIRD** 24/7 Defibrilator

The third 24/7 access defibrillator in Thorpe St Andrew has been installed following grant funding from three District Councillors. Cllr Sue Lawn, Cllr Trudy Mancini-Boyle, and Cllr Jonathon Emsell, have jointly funded the defibrillator, which is located on Roxley Hall, Yarmouth Road. The other defibrillators, all on Town Council sites, are

Yarmouth Road. The other defibrillators, all on Town Council sites, are located inside the Town Hall, outside the Café at the Sir George Morse Park, and at River Green.

A defibrillator at Roxley Hall has been a longstanding ambition of the Council, and we are delighted that our three South-East ward District Councillors have chosen to fund this worthwhile project. Speaking at the unveiling, the Town Mayor Cllr Sue Lawn said "accessible defibrillators are essential to communities and being able to deliver one which is accessible all-year round at Roxley Hall is fantastic". Cllr Mancini-Boyle explained "when the Town Council identified Roxley Hall as a priority site, we felt strongly that funding this project was what we wanted to do with our Broadland District Council members grant". Cllr Jonathon Emsell further explained "Knowing the defibrillator is here will be reassuring to many residents in the local area, but also the many Roxley Hall users, which is a hub in the community".

The new defibrillator was unveiled by ClIr Sue Lawn, ClIr Trudy Mancini-Boyle, and ClIr Jonathon Emsell at Roxley Hall, where they also expressed their appreciation to local electrician Chris Wilson who installed the defibrillator cabinet at no cost.



As autumn begins, we can look forward to one last burst of colour before the leaves begin to fall. A wonderful time of year for walks through the woods, with leaves crunching underfoot and sycamore seeds twisting to the ground. As trees enter their dormant period, we can turn our sights to the tree planting season which runs from November to early March. As your local Tree Warden, I will be working closely with Thorpe St Andrew Parish Council to plant more trees and to give a voice to the many beautiful trees we already have.

### Planning Update

In this article we hear from Cllr John Fisher, Chair of the Planning and Environment Committee.

As a further update on the current planning issues impacting upon Thorpe St Andrew we are waiting for formal applications to be lodged with Broadland by Berliet /Ocubis for the Pinebanks, Langley and Griffin Lane sites. To our knowledge responses have been made to residents who raised specific queries as a result of the public consultation for these sites.



The public meeting arranged by Hill, the developers for the Racecourse Wood site was well attended with around 250 attending and I understand that Hill were very impressed with the local interest and the queries raised. The decision by the planning inspector indicated that she felt 300 dwellings could be accommodated within the site boundary but the Hill designers currently consider that to provide a high quality development to include sufficient green and recreational space this number is actually too high and so are currently considering designs which would reduce that number.



#### V is for volunteering!

The October meeting of the Planning and Environment Committee considered the Application for the Care Home proposal for the Griffin site and the decision was to fully support the proposal. The revised proposal has reduced the number of units and also reduced the mass of the building on to the Yarmouth Road street scene plus it provides a more sympathetic elevation towards the listed building to the east, the old Meadowlands building.

### Update from East Norwich Surgeries.

Five surgeries from the City form part of Norwich Primary Care Network. We meet regularly and share the same pressures. Many patients share the same frustrations at present and a continuous comment is "When are doctors going to do face to face appointments again?" From the start of the pandemic and throughout, none of the surgeries have stopped having face to face appointments.

The doctors, nurse teams and allied health professionals have continued to see patients. There has been a strict triage in that those presenting with any Covid- 19 symptoms would have to be signposted to designated locations to be seen.

A constant threat is a patient or staff member bringing Covid-19 into the surgery. This could result in the whole surgery having to close. Doctors and surgery staff continue to take tests prior to coming to work in order for this not to happen. For the record, surgeries and doctors have continued to see patients.

As we all get used to the situation of living with the Covid-19 threat, one of the results of this is a huge demand to want to see a doctor. All surgeries have developed coping strategies. Currently if the surgeries each had 20 doctors and 20 reception staff to take the calls and see patients, it would not meet the current demand.

Patients using Footfall and Econsult online services requesting assistance with a problem are helping in reducing telephone calls. However, the Covid-19 vaccine programme has been an obstacle in reducing the wait patients have on the phone.

There has been in excess of 82,000 vaccinations administered in our area over the past few weeks. Only a small number of the appointments are directly completed with online access. This means approximately 74,000 calls over and above a normal day have been made to our five surgeries. The reception teams are making the appointments for their listed patients. Appreciations are extended to Lionwood Surgery for hosting the vaccinations for this area.

Surgeries across the country are having similar experiences. The systems of online access triaging or telephone triaging by doctors prior to confirming a face to face appointment are ensuring:

- The risk of Covid-19 to other patients and staff is reduced
- Those people who need to be seen are being seen or diverted to other care paths if the appointments for that day are exhausted at the surgery.

Your understanding is asked for please. All surgeries do have doctors, allied health professionals and nurses conducting face to face appointments. These are on the increase, but please remember need comes before want.

## Thorpe St Andrew Neighbourhood Plan - update

Earlier this year Thorpe St Andrew undertook a 6-week consultation (28th June to the 10th August 2021) with local residents about the proposed Neighbourhood Plan. Consultation included an online survey as well as 6 weekly face-to-face sessions.

We would like to take the opportunity to say thank you to the very many people who came to talk to us about their thoughts and provided us with useful comments. It's great to see so many people taking an active interest in the plan for the place they live.

As part of the process Thorpe St Andrew will now compile all the comments and the survey results and these together will form part of the submission that goes to Broadland District Council. We hope that there will be a referendum in 2022 and that once this document has been confirmed by a public vote it will become an enforceable planning document. We hope to have more news once Broadland District Council have considered our submisission.

The Thorpe St Andrew Dementia Support continues to grow as we progress further out of lockdown.

We worked hard to maintain contact throughout the period when we were not able to run physical sessions and are delighted to say that our previous clients are still with us plus we have had several new families recently join too. Services are so much in demand that we have increased our sessions to twice a month - on the 3rd (mornings) and 4th Wednesdays (afternoons) All sessions take place in the Roxley Hall, Yarmouth Rd. We have also been very fortunate to have an influx of wonderful new volunteers joining our already brilliant team, without whom we would not be able to continue to run these groups.

We are also back running the Roxley Singers. They take place at 10.00am on the 4th Wednesday taken by Choir Mistress Brenda Binns. Everyone is made very welcome, and we

have a good mixture of residents and a few of our dementia clients come along too! It's a fun morning and you don't need to be an expert singer to come and enjoy!


