



#### Planning Update

In this article we hear from Cllr John Fisher, Chair of the Planning and Environment Committee.

Whilst the previous two publications of TSA News have covered the involvement of the role of the Planning and Environment Committee in the major Planning Applications of Pinebanks and Thorpe Woods, the core activity centres upon the plethora of routine applications for extensions, roof conversions, and any proposed changes to, or within the curtilage of, the many listed buildings in Thorpe St Andrew.



In 2021 the committee considered a total 128 applications and so far this year there have been over 30 applications received already. Each application is designated to one of the councillors on the committee and their contact details are included in letters to the applicant and neighbours as the point of contact. The councillor will also endeavour to visit the site to gain a good understanding of what is proposed and how it relates to neighbouring properties, the street scene, size, design etc.

During the Covid period site visits were not possible in many cases but google maps allowed a good interpretation to take place and where applicants or neighbours requested a visit, this was accommodated. The committee are now back to meeting in person every second Monday of the month and we welcome members of the public to attend. Interestingly when we were having virtual meetings we saw an increase in attendance by residents.

An analysis of applications as stated above, indicates that rear extensions and roof conversions to the 'traditional' Thorpe St Andrew bungalows are by far the majority of applications, and having been on the committee for a number of years I can identify a trend to larger more lavish extensions and larger roof conversions often involving a major redesign of the hipped roof to include a gable end. These facts identify and confirm what an excellent



place Thorpe St Andrew is to live, with residents keen to expand houses to stay here rather than moving away to other locations or to larger homes. The fact that early development in the town was in the 30s to 60s the average garden is of significant size which also allows good sized extensions to be built. I would like to take this opportunity to thank fellow councillors on the committee for their time and wisdom on all applications large or small.



**Towns across Norfolk to get Covid Plaque**

#### £64,000 of new play equipment planned!

Thorpe St Andrew Town Council has long been committed to providing high quality, diverse and inclusive play equipment for our residents and visitors.

With the increasing popularity of the Sir George Morse Park and the Little Park Cafe we have decided to update this play area as a priority.

Earlier this year the tender for new and updated play equipment was issued to a number of key suppliers. The allocated spend has already been agreed by councillors and a final decsion will be made in March. We hope that the equipment can then be ordered and we look forward to installation in the summer.

Jubilee Tree Planting - over 120 new trees in Thorpe St Andrew!

In celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee we are delighted to announce that we will be planting over 120 new trees in the Thorpe St Andrew area. This will include new trees at the Town Hall, Fitzmaurice Park where we will be planting an orchard, as well as a plan to plant trees along Dussindale Drive. There will also be giant tubs designed for edible plants for public access and use. Plants will include herbs such as mint, rosemary and fennel as well

as fruit plants such as strawberry and raspberry. They will be planted with height in the centre and ground cover at the edges. The planters will be complimented by a circle of up to 15 trees and fruit bearing shrubs to attract bees.

We are extremely grateful to Cllr John Fisher who has used his Norfolk County

Council grant money, plus funding from Broadland District Council and support from Thorpe St Andrew Town Council to enable the purchase and planting of these trees to go ahead.



We are also continuing our annual Winter Management Plan, which will include hedge planting and general tree and shrub maintenance around the town. Some of this work has been carried out in conjunction with the tree council and we are delighted to be working in partnership with them.

#### **Broadland Tree Warden - update**

At the beginning of February, I worked with the Parks and Estates team at Thorpe St Andrew Town Council team to plant a new hedge at the northern edge of Hillside Allotments. The hedge will form a natural boundary to the area. Seven native tree species were chosen,including field maple, common dogwood, hawthorn, holly, blackthorn, buckthorn and guelder rose. Most of these species are either prickly or thorny so they will form a thick, protective habitat for the countless animals living in the area and the berries will be a valuable food source for wildlife throughout the winter months.
