### 6. Conservation and Listed Building Statement:

Following the planning and Environment Committee meeting on 9<sup>th</sup> October 2023, committee members would like to make the following representation on behalf of Thorpe St Andrew.

Thorpe St Andrew Town Council has started to see an increase in applications for planning permission in relation to listed buildings. The council is fully appreciative and in support of the preservation of these sites. However, we would like to like to share our view that some flexibility should be shown wherever possible to enable homeowners to make sympathetic improvements in areas of sustainability and accessibility.

This is specifically relevant where this provides a benefit environmentally, such as the installation of air source heating for example, or where modifications improve the accessibility and usability of the building for current and future generations.

In these cases equipment should be accepted where possible, but sympathetically placed and camouflaged to compliment the building or conservation area. Several areas within Thorpe St Andrew have a window and door colour policy – it may be useful to include heat pumps within this.

The Town Council **RESOLVED** to attach the above statement to any applicable decisions going forward.
