The minutes of the meeting held on 8 January 2024 were signed and approved as a true record.

- 4 Announcements (For information only)
- 4.1 The Town Mayor, on behalf of the Council, sends best wishes to the King after this evening's cancer diagnosis announcement and wishes him a speedy recovery.
- **4.2** The Town Clerk updated the members on the following:
 - The Neighbourhood Plan has been approved to go to referendum, probably in May.
 - First meeting with Father James took place this month, very positive meeting which will
 continue. Also discussed, was the work the Church and Heritage Group are doing on
 commemorating the railway disaster. How the Council can support with the event will be
 added to the March agenda.
- Public Participation To consider a motion to suspend the meeting to allow members of the public the opportunity to address the meeting limited to 3 mins each.
- 5.1 Norfolk Constabulary Crime report noted with the following action:

<u>Action</u> - Town Clerk to request a more detailed and geographically correct report for Thorpe St Andrew in future. Also to raise the Yarmouth Rd residents' complaints about the increase in police vehicle sirens and lights, using the road at all times of day and night, since the new station has been in operation.

5.2 County and District Councillors – Cllr Ward's report noted. Cllr Fisher updated members on the Heartsease roundabout completion date, now 5 May 2024. Cllr Berry recently attended the BDC Overview and Scrutiny meeting, discussing many things including, selling of Thorpe Lodge, anti-social behaviour and business revenue support. Also advising members of an impact on

residents, traveling in the west of Broadland and Norfolk until the end of December 2024, due to abnormal loads transporting equipment weekly for the Hornsea 3 project.

- a. Creation of New Community Space, Sir George Morse Park Applied for the Pride in Place Community grant, the panel will look at these in detail mid-February.
- b. Improved Play Area at the Fitzmaurice Park- Slightly behind schedule, as still waiting on one contractor.
- c. **Anglia in Bloom -** Cannot enter as 2024 application not released yet. Town Clerk and Parks and Estates Manager attending a launch meeting in March to learn more.

The Town Clerk briefed the Members to consider a new proposal for sponsorship of community events, the attached report outlined the proposal and recommendations. Positive discussion and ideas were put forward by Clirs.

It was proposed by Cllr Bowe and with a unanimous show of hands **RESOLVED** that the Town Clerk provides a detailed proposal at the next meeting.

Subsequently to the Resolution, Cllr Buck requested early viewing of the proposal.

Action - Town Clerk to send out the marketing package/proposal to Clirs this week.

9 LED Streetlights - Report attached

The RFO provided some background and summarised the proposal and decisions required from the council as laid out in the report.

It was proposed by Clir Fisher, seconded by Clir Snelling and with a unanimous show of hands **RESOLVED** to accept the 3 recommendations on page 15 of the report, and to apply for a loan with the PWLB for a term of 10 years.

10 Defence Employer Recognition Scheme 2024 Silver Award Expression of Interest - Attachment noted

It was proposed by Cllr Bowe, with a unanimous show of hands, **RESOLVED** to ask the Town Clerk to make amendments to current policies, to facilitate the expression of interest before the deadline, mid-March.

- 11 Exclusion of Press and Public All members of the public left the building.
- 12 To consider actions relating to the River Bed Lease Note Attached.

The Town Clerk asked the Members to consider and decide on the following:

- i) To set up a company to manage the River Bed Lease, or return the lease before the end of March 24
- ii) Appoint Politis Consulting to support the council in the creation of a company

Much discussion took place with all councillors participating. Cllr Bailey asked for clarification on costs, better understanding of what can be enforced and the income stream, the Town Clerk responded. Cllr Fisher advised that it is the Town Council's responsibility to finally take action on behalf of the residents of Thorpe St Andrew and sort River Green out, including the wider area and marshes. Also, asking if 3 quotes would be required.

The Town Clerk advised Members that the quote received is likely difficult to provide a comparable price for, because of the years of knowledge and expertise Thomas Foreman has in this specific and that there wouldn't be a conflict of interest. If required, the Town Clerk will source alternative quotes to ensure due diligence.

It was proposed by Cllr Fisher, seconded by Cllr Buck and with 9 in approval, 4 against and 2 abstentions it was **RESOLVED** to agree in principle with the company set up, subject to 3 quotes and the Town Clerk to decide on the most appropriate quote.

Report from County Councillor John Ward

The Heartsease roundabout will be fully closed from 13.4.24 for 5 weeks for resurfacing work. The whole project is now 4 weeks behind schedule. Details of the project can be found at www.norfolk.gov.uk/heartsease

Norfolk County Council propose to make a Road Traffic Act Order limiting speed to 20mph on all the new estate roads behind Tesco, Blue Boar Lane, eg Blaxter Way etc.

The Norfolk Assistance Scheme and the Money support Scheme have been incorporated into the Client Hardship Service. Those in financial difficulties can contact norfolk.gov.uk/chs to see what help is available.

Apprentice Social Workers have celebrated completing their 3 year programme with a Graduation Ceremony. Social Work apprentices are able to study for a fully funded B.A. (Hon) in Social Work whilst working and being paid as full time employees of Norfolk County Council.

Norfolk County Council is supporting a 2 year Film Office programme to generate an increase in economic activity via an increase in filming activity across the County.

In order to protect wildlife, the Council is asking people not to use flying rings on the beach or to set off sky lanterns or gas filled balloons.

All major housing developments (and from 2/4 also small developments) must now produce a minimum 10% Bio Diversity Gain, eg if 10 trees are removed then 11 must be planted.

Norfolk is to receive £1m Government funds to tackle Anti Social behaviour. This should result in a lot more police patrols.

Ancient House Museum has received a £200k grant from the National Heritage Lottery Fund to develop it's Duleep Singh Gallery.


On Thursday 1st February, Cllr Penny Carpenter, Mayor of Great Yarmouth, officially opened their new Herring Bridge.

Council Leader Kay Mason-Billig led a delegation to Westminster on the 71st Anniversary of the 1953 Floods, to explain the risks Norfolk faces and how those risks could be addressed.

Norwich Castle recorded 224,581 visitors in 2023 1/4-30/11. The same period in 2022 was 187,848. There were 400 applications for the 5 new Museum Teaching Trainee Posts.

My mother lives at Gordon Ave NR7 0DP and the road has obviously become extremely busy since the Heartsease Roundabout project has started.

Gordon Ave has become part of the diversion . Buses also now use this route .

A premier shop has now opened on Gordon Ave a short while ago, Many more shoppers are now using this cut through and are now aware of the shortcut and the shop that is there.

The parking on the Hillcrest Ave / Gordon Ave T- junction has become extremely dangerous . Customers are dumping their car anywhere to go in and grab some groceries .

My mother tries to pull out of her drive and cannot see up the road, due to a large transit van dumped on the verge or two cars completely blocking her view. Cars, vans, trucks, they come and go all day.

Buses overtaking the parked cars , cyclists coming round the parked cars Her line of sight up the road completely hampered .

It's my understanding that there are clear rules for parking away from a junction . My fear is there will be a dreadful accident if something isn't done . I ask two things

Following a site visit last week with Cllr. Ian Mackie, local residents and representatives from the Norfolk Wildlife Trust, we have agreed to carry out some maintenance works and minor vegetation clearance to the former gravel pit between Western Wood and Western Ave.

This won't involve any works to protected trees and will focus on strimming and clearance of the pathways to enhance and improve the experience for local residents using the area. I've highlighted the attached satellite image to indicate where the clearance will take place. The scope and extent of the strimming were agreed with Norfolk Wildlife Trust on site.

The works will be carried out by AT Coombes Arboriculturists and there will be signage up to notify the public.



On behalf of the Great Thorpe Railway Disaster 150 group, we would like to request that Thorpe St Andrew Town Council consider an appeal for a contribution to funds.

The 10th September 2024 will mark the 150th anniversary of this Victorian railway collision, which took place directly behind The Rushcutters Inn (then known as The Three Tuns). The incident was later described by the Board of Trade Inquiry as being "the most serious collision between trains meeting one another on a single line of rails [...] that has yet been experienced in this country." Ultimately, 26 people lost their lives, including men, women, and children.

Groups based in Thorpe St Andrew, including St Andrew's Church, Thorpe History Group, Thorpe Players and the local branch of The British Legion, have come together to arrange a commemorative weekend of events on 13-15th September, and to co-ordinate an effort raise funds to commission a bronze embossed plaque to commemorate the 26 who died as a result of the collision. It is hoped that this will be installed on the rear wall of the Parish Church, and dedicated by The Bishop of Norwich at a special morning service on 15th September. The cost of the plaque will be around £3,500. We are appealing to other agencies and are encouraged by the positive response so far. Donors will be acknowledged in a printed information booklet, to be available for visitors in the church. A mock-up of the plaque is attached for your interest.

We would be most grateful if Thorpe St Andrew Town Council would consider contributing to this fund to mark this historic occasion.
